This has been my first year in the role of Development Officer and as such during the first half of the year I was heavily reliant on the members of our association who were involved prior to my appointment. I would like to thank Chris Stuart and Kerry Collins for running the 2019 Association Carnival and 2019 Metro League squads, respectively.

As always our teams in the Association Carnival performed to a very high standard, in many instances competing against athletes from bigger Associations than our own and producing displays way above expectation. This was also the case in Metro League where our athletes rose to the occasion to put in impressive performances in what is now the highest level of competition for Association teams. Well done to all Athletes, Coaches, Managers and other JNA members involved, you are a credit to our Association and I look forward to seeing you perform again next year.

The second half of the year has been spent looking to the future and facilitating change that will hopefully help us to improve the level of both our coaches and athletes moving forward. 4 clinics were provided to help coaches of all skill levels from Net Set Go to Association Representative improve their knowledge and skill set. We are also in the process of moving our Rep Coaches along the pathway with 5 Metro League coaches currently engaged in programs, with several Association Championship coaches due to begin in the near future.

The Launch of the JETS program will see our rep squads embark on longer training programs with higher qualified coaches, a dedicated Strength and Conditioning program, plus the arrival of a Physiotherapy specialist in the New Year. All of these initiatives will hopefully pay dividends in the future.

The highlight of the year for me has been the Future JETS program. Thanks to Association subsidies we have been able to provide a free training program to our U10s athletes. The aim of the program is to provide them with high level skills coaching as they transition from Net Set Go to full rules. For the athletes who transition onto phase 2 of the program, (asU11's), it will provide an insight into Representative squad training alongside our current Rep Squads in preparation for the coming years. Thank you to Head Coach Jan Rowe and her team of coaches for all of their hard work.

Finally thank you to everyone who has helped and supported me through my first year, especially Kylie Kershaw, Sharon Knott, Jo Bayliss, Viv Iellamo and Kaylene Barnett. Apologies if I have forgotten anyone but these people moan at me the most and as result stick in my mind.









